He has done ecology and conservation work with The Nature Conservancy, National Audubon, Rutgers University and is currently a research associate with the New York State Museum fish survey lab and Western Connecticut state university zoology lab. Rep. Michael Grimm to Fly Local Hero's Battle Flag over U.S. Capitol

WASHINGTON, DC- Congressman **Michael G. Grimm** (R,C-NY) will honor Staten Island-native Army Specialist **Chris Graffagnino** by flying his battle flag over the U.S. Capitol, adding to the list of places the flag has been, mostly in combat zones. The flag accompanied Graffagnino and his platoon throughout his entire 13 month deployment. Written on the flag is the unit that he was with and every place the flag has been during his Afghanistan Campaign

"Having served in combat myself, I know the power of the American flag as a symbol of comfort to our troops in the field and as one of strength to our enemies," said. Grimm. "Specialist Graffagnino's story is inspiring and his service to our nation is noteworthy. Like our men and women in uniform, this flag has made the journey from warzone to home, and it is my esteemed pleasure to fly it high above the United States Capitol for all to see."

While stationed at remote Forward Operating Base (FOB) Kalagush in Nurestan Province, Afghanistan, Graffagnino's combat team confronted enemy troops hundreds of times in heavy firefights. On July 3, 2010, the small Observation Post (named OP Loyalty) above their base was overrun by hundreds of enemy fighters and FOB Kalagush was under heavy attack and was threatened of being overrun as well. After holding their ground on the FOB, American artillery began an all night fury assault on OP Loyalty, driving enemy fighters away from the post long enough to make a vital counter assault.

On the 4th of July, 2010, Graffagnino and 13 other members from his company were inserted via helicopter at the top of the 7500 ft. mountain and quickly took tactical positions to regain control of OP Loyalty. Along with aid from attack helicopters, the soldiers rained down missiles and machine gun fire to spotted targets.

After a long lull in the fighting, Graffagnino then took the American flag, tied it to a metal stake and drove it into the highest point of the observation post on top of the mountain to let the enemy know the Americans were still alive. Moments after this was done, the platoon took heavy small arms and RPG fire until all enemy combatants were either eliminated or retreated.

The flag sustained some damage, from bullets and shrapnel flying in the air, but still flew high for the remainder of the week they spent on the mountain top. No other attempts of attacks were ever made on the post again any time Americans were up there and the flag was displayed.

Graffagnino served with the Delta Company 1st battalion 102nd mountain infantry during Operation Enduring Freedom Task Force Iron Gray. Rep. Michael Grimm is a Marine Combat veteran who served in the Persian Gulf War.

NY AQUARIUM GROWS ITS OWN REEFS

Some of the ocean's most beautiful secrets are now on display at the New York Aquarium in Coney Island. The aquarium recently opened two exhibits featuring 16 tanks of blue, yellow, pink and orange coral that is being grown right at the Surf Ave. facility.

"Growing corals...preserve these fragile ecosystems while educating the public about coral reefs in the world," said Wildlife Conservation Society Vice President and New York Aquarium director **Jon Forrest Dohlin**.

Due to the disturbances like climate change and unchecked coastal development, nearly one-third of the world's coral reefs have been lost. Some estimates predict corals will be extinct by 2050.

So the aquarium is growing its own with names like "*xenia*" and "pink bird's nest," between 25 and 30 different species which produce hundreds of colorful hard and soft corals.

The slow-forming corals, which are grown from tiny fragments, may take two to four years to mature. Aquarium staff start the growing process by creating their own filtered water, sometimes adding just the right mix of salt and calcium to the tanks.

Visitors can see the corals in the aquarium's Conservation Hall and Glover's Reef exhibits.

The aquarium is located at Surf Ave. at W. Eighth St. in Coney Island and opens at 10 am daily. For information, call (718) 265-FISH or visit the website www,nyaquarium.com.
