

THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER



lways cultivate a good relationship with your marine tropical fish dealer. He should get to know about your marine system and the livestock you have in it, so that he will be in a better position to offer you advice in the event you have a problem, also to help avoid problems and to reduce the risk of introducing disease. SEARCHING FOR A GREAT WHITE SHARK, IN THE WATERS OFF LONG ISLAND Samantha Schmidtaug, August 16, 2016 NYT

ABOARD THE RESEARCH SHIP THE MV OCEARCH, off Long Island — Brett McBride lined up his fishing wires in the ship's tackle room, carefully ensuring that all knots were tied and all hooks were in place. For Mr. McBride, the captain of the converted crabbing vessel, precise organization of this equipment would be crucial to ensnare a creature that drew his ship to these waters: a great white shark.

In an expedition over about two weeks, Mr. McBride and other members of the shark-tracking organization **Ocearch**, along with scientists from the **Wildlife Conservation Society.** By monitoring the movement and behavior of these fish, researchers hope to show a theory that this swath of the Long Island coastline serves as a great white breeding ground.

Ocearch, founded by Chris Fischer, a former television host, has embarked on 25 previous expeditions worldwide, tagging hundreds of sharks, including five on the East Coast, since 2007. But this is the first time Ocearch has set its sights on the New York Bight.

The bight, a stretch of the Atlantic Ocean

between Cape May, N.J., and Montauk Point on Long Island, is home to more than two dozen species of sharks, said Merry Camhi,

director of **New** York Seascape at the New York **Aguarium** and one of the scientists accompanying the Ocearch crew.

"If we have sharks here, it's sort of an indicator that our ecosystem is doing well," Dr. Camhi said.

Scientists understand very little about the movements and migratory patterns of juvenile sharks, said Tobey Curtis, a fishery management specialist with the National Marine Fisheries Service and one of the expedition's lead scientists. But they know the New York coast is a hot spot for them

When Mr. Curtis and other researchers compiled records of 200 years of great white shark sightings in the North Atlantic, they found that two-thirds of newborn sharks were documented in the New York Bight, he said.

"The big question is, why are they here?" he said.
"When they leave, where do they go?"

Many experts suspect shark mothers might leave

their pups in the region because of the shallow water and plentiful food, Mr. Curtis said. The shelter of the local bays also might protect young sharks from adult predators, Dr. Camhi said.

Sharks are most vulnerable in their early years, and they require additional protection, Mr. Curtis said. By studying a juvenile shark's habitat use, migration patterns and other behaviors, scientists can more effectively suggest policy plans to conserve the species.

"You want those little fish to grow up into big fish and produce more little fish," Mr. Curtis said.

Sharks play a crucial role in the food chain of the seas.

By eating sick and weak fish they prevent the spread of disease. After decades of decline, the white shark population is

slowly climbing, according to a 2014 study by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, but scientists say the species is still vulnerable to exploitation.

"If we continue to lose our sharks, there's not going to be any fish," Mr. Fischer said. "Those juvenile white sharks are

the great balance keepers as they grow up."

If the Ocearch team can prove that the New York Bight is a great white nursery, it would be the first proven site in the North Atlantic, an addition to a small list of other known breeding grounds in places like eastern Australia, South Africa and Southern California, Mr. Curtis said.

The sheer size and strength of a great white shark makes it difficult for researchers to tag the fish, Mr. Fischer said. The MV Ocearch, a 126-foot vessel equipped with a 75,000-

pound hydraulic platform, provides scientists with rare access to sharks. But catching them must come first.

> At the stern of the boat on Sunday, a deck hand watched the five buoys for any indication that a shark might be biting the bait attached to the bottom of each one. A makeshift seal — which the crew named Chewy - dangled from a line off the back of the vessel, posing as prey for sharks. Mr. McBride drove a tender boat around the vessel, fishing

from farther away. If

a shark were to latch onto his bait, he would lead it to the mother ship, which would lift it out of the water with its hydraulic platform. The team would have 15 minutes to tag the fish and perform all tests before

releasing it into the water.

After scanning the waters from dawn until dusk, the team did not see any signs of a great white shark.

The crew members did, however, tag their first fish of the trip — a smooth dogfish, a small, gray-colored shark.

By tagging species like dogfish in addition to white sharks, the team will be able to better understand the interaction and movement among species.

Placing the flailing fish on top of a tank, the deckhand,

D. J. Lettieri, 23, held it down as Mr. Fischer stuck a hose inside its mouth, the water flowing through the fish's gills to help it breathe.

Dr. Harley Newton, a veterinarian and the head of Aguatic Health at the New York Aguarium, cut a small incision in the dogfish's side, then placed an acoustic tagging device inside before stitching the incision closed.

After taking a blood sample, the crew members carefully released the fish back to its home in the water.

"Now we'll see when that shark shows up," Mr. Fischer said.

he fire that consumed the Deutsche Bank building was one of the worst fires in New York City's history. 


