oe Yaiullo is the Curator of Long Island Aquarium & Exhibition Center

He will be talking about eleven years of feeding their 20,000 gallon Live Coral Tank closed reef system and some of the things he learned that you can apply in your coral tank at home.

Born and raised on Long Island, Joe graduated Southampton College with a BS in Marine Biology. He is married with 3 sons and lives in Aquebogue, NY.


Joe worked at the New York Aquarium for 8 years (1987-1995), and left to pursue a dream of building an aquarium on Long Island. He was intermential in designing, developing and building the Long Island Aquarium & Exhibition Center, located at 431 East Main Street, Riverhead, NY, 11901 which opened in June 2000.

The Long Island Aquarium & Exhibition Center's exhibits include a 2,000 gallon clownfish/anemone tank, 120,000 gallon Shark Tank and a 20,000 gallon Live Coral Tank, which to date is the largest closed reef system in North and South America, and the 4th largest in the world.

The Long Island Aquarium & Exhibition Center also features a unique 2 hour environmental tour boat, the Atlantis Explorer, that navigates down the Peconic River and Flanders Bay. The tour is hosted by naturalists. The tour includes hands-on activities such as trap pulls, plankton tows, live underwater video footage of the various types of marine life encountered off Long Island beaches.

There is also a shoreline stroll along a remote region of Flanders Bay. Their web site is (www.atlantismarineworld.com) Their phone number is 631-208-9200.

Joe is a great speaker and knows his stuff. This should be a fascinating presentation and you'll be able to ask Joe questions about what to feed your reef tank and marine fish to keep them in top notch health. So come on down and join us for this special talk by a real pro.





AQUARIUM'S BREEDING PROGRAM NETS RESULTS

Newsday, Monday, November 21, 2011: Three years of work at the Long Island Aquarium in Riverhead has resulted in the successful breeding -- all the way through the larval stage -- of a small, colorful and shy fish called the reef basslet.

That progress, aquarium officials say, is a key step toward their goal of raising the fish in captivity, something they say has never been done.

Aquaculturist **Todd Gardner** started working with the fish when the aquarium received two of them as a gift three years ago. Now, after a larval breeding stage that lasted more than two months, a dozen fish have reached the settlement stage.

Gardner, who described the breeding as "the first big step," said several factors could


have contributed to the success, from separating and disinfecting the eggs to the colors of the rocks used in the breeding tanks.

People who buy tickets to the aquarium cannot view the fish -- the work is done in a behind-the-scenes area -- but anyone can see them at youtu.be/TocX5wepnTK.

There are about a dozen species of reef basslets; the candy basslets being raised in Riverhead are usually less than six inches long

Aquarium officials say the work could lead to successful breeding of the species, which is naturally found from the Florida Keys through the Caribbean and in South America.
