THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER

Todd Gardner is an aquaculturist at the Long Island Aquarium & Exhibition Center. He was spawned and reared in Centerport, New York. His aquarium-keeping habit started around age 6, encouraged by his parents and an abundance of local marine life. Within a short time, Todd's fish room had reached such proportions that his 4th grade class took a field trip to visit it. Not to be hindered by the high price of the hobby, Todd survived on donations of used aquarium supplies from friends and neighbors. He even collected his own specimens when every family vacation and trip to the beach turned into a collecting expedition. In 1988, Todd attended East Stroudsburg University where he founded the ESU Marine Science Club. This gave him a great excuse to mount more serious collecting expeditions with like-minded students, which helped keep the ESU aquarium room well stocked with an array of marine life. In 1991, while working as an intern at the National Aquarium in Baltimore, Todd became acquainted with the techniques of algae and rotifer culture, two skills that would open up a whole new world to him.

He graduated from East Stroudsburg University with a bachelor's degree in biology and marine science. After graduation, he spent a year working for Blue Earth Films, assisting in the production of a National Geographic Explorer feature film about coastal marine life. His job was to collect and maintain the creatures for filming in aquaria. It was in those tanks that Todd experienced his first successes in the spawning and rearing of marine fish. He found fish culture to be so

addictive that he felt he had little choice but to devote his life to it. After extensive research, Todd made a list of the world's most interesting-sounding fish hatcheries, and sent a resume to each one. A few months later, he received a letter from **Bill Addison**, inviting him to come to Puerto Rico for the challenge of his life: to save C-quest, a company that had been losing an average of \$20,000 each month for the previous 8 years. Todd spent 3 years at C-quest where he worked on developing technology for the production of new marine species.

His most spectacular contribution was the development of a technique for commercial scale production of the *Pseudochromids* (dottybacks), allowing for the first widespread availability of several species including *Pseudochromis fridmani*, *P.* aldabrensis, P. flavivertex, and P. springeri. In September, 1998, Todd decided it was time to get more serious about aquaculture research, and with much regret, left C-quest behind to pursue a master's degree in biology at New York's Hofstra University. Studying under Dr. Eugene Kaplan, Todd has recently completed construction of a marine ornamental fish culture facility in the basement of Hofstra's biology building, where he is carrying out his research on the culture of our local seahorse, *Hippocampus erectus*.

Todd's talk will be on getting started in marine aquaculture. If you are setting up a marine aquarium or have been thinking about making the move to a marine aquarium, this talk by an expert marine fish breeder is a must attend event!

All BAS meetings begin at 7:30pm.



PIJAC PetAlert: Dwarf Seahorses May Be Listed As Endangered Species - Public Comment Due July 3, 2012

he National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) published its 90-day findings in the Federal Register (F.R.) in response to a Petition submitted by the Center for Biological Diversity to list the dwarf seahorse (Hippocampus zosterae) as threatened or endangered and designate their habitat as "critical habitat" under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). NMFS concluded that the Petition and information in NMFS files indicates that there is "substantial scientific or commercial information indicating" that protecting the dwarf seahorse under the ESA may be warranted. However, NMFS recognizes some

gaps in the data at hand and is seeking additional information. See Federal Register Notice (77 F.R. 26478-26486, May 4, 2012).

The Impact: A listing would ban trade in Dwarf seahorses. A ban would prohibit not only U.S. imports and exports but also all interstate movements. The Petition claims, among other things, that Dwarf seahorses are endangered because: Florida's seagrass habitat has diminished by more than 50% since 1950 – losses in some areas as high as 90%; Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Texas and the Bahamas are encountering "dra-

matic" habitat losses; Gulf of Mexico has been adversely impacted by oil spills; and significant population depletion caused by commercial collection for ornamental fish trade, curios, and traditional medicines. PIJAC Position: PIJAC is conducting a review of the NMFS Notice to determine the accuracy and quality of the findings made by NMFS. The Notice indicates several areas where NMFS is not convinced that the petitioner's information is sufficient. It also states that some of the materials relied

upon are limited in scope and contain some dated or incomplete data. Furthermore, the sampling methodologies are far from clear and may not be appropriate to support the conclusions related to the species low abundance or decline. **Recommended Action:** Prior to making its final decision, NMFS is seeking additional scientific and commercial information to ensure that a final decision is based on the best available information. **NMFS is specifically seeking:**

Historical and current distribution and abundance data of *H. zosterae* throughout its



range. Historical and current population status and trends. Life history in marine environments Curio, traditional medicine, and aquarium trade or other trade data. Any current or planned activities that may adversely impact the species. Historical and current seagrass trends and status. Ongoing or planned efforts to protect and restore the species and their seagrass habitats. Management, regulatory, and enforcement information. Any biological information on the species. PIJAC seeks input from interested persons as to any information they possess that may be incorporated in PIJAC's response to questions raised by NMFS. Anyone willing to share data as to the number of dwarf seahorses they handle (please separate information regarding wild harvested vs. captive/tank raised), as well as economic impact, please send to Marshall Meyers. All information received by PIJAC is considered proprietary and will not be released. **PIJAC also needs data on the volume of Dwarf** seahorses harvested for: ornamental fish trade curio trade, traditional medicine trade, other trade areas; volume of intra-US trade of US harvested or cultured specimens; volume of US exports and imports; and captive-breeding initiatives underway in the U.S. and elsewhere. **Such infor**mation should be submitted to PIJAC by no **later than June 20, 2012.** We encourage those concerned with this issue to review the following documents for accuracy and completeness and submit written comments to NMFS by the July 3, 2010 deadline: NMFS 90-Day Findings, Center for Biological Diversity Petition NMFS is seeking further information to buttress its preliminary findings; therefore, it is important to carefully review the underlying Petition as well as the materials NMFS references in its findings. In conducting

your review be sure to evaluate the materials to see if the comments made regarding the original source materials are accurate and reliable, and that the source materials contain sufficient information upon which to make the determinations made by the petitioner of NMFS. **Specific areas** to focus on for accuracy and completeness of **NMFS findings:** Analysis of underlying Petition --- F. R. pages 26480-26482, Species Description – F.R. page 26480, Present/Threatened Destructions, Modification or Curtailment of Species Habitat or Range – F.R. pages 26482-26483, Overutilization – F.R. pages 26483-484, Inadequacy of Exiting Regulatory mechanisms – F.R. pages 26484-26485, Natural or Man-made factors impacting species – F.R. pages 26485-26486. When responding to the above areas: Be as specific as you can; Explain the sources you are relying upon and provide references to documents when possible. Include personal observations; and include relevant articles. A copy of the Federal Register notice and other pertinent documents can be found in the NOAA-NMFS-2012-0101 Docket Folder of the regulations.gov website or in the update field of this PetAlert on the Breaking News page of the PIJAC website. 




