

land Aquarium & Exhibition Center, located in Riverhead, Long Island.



COLD WEATHER HELP FOR YOUR FISH FROM BAS

ith cold weather setting in, transporting livestock home can be a problem. If you know you're going to buy fish or corals, you should have an insulated bag to carry them home. The BAS has developed a great insulated carrying bag for members; with a reflective aluminum foil interior. It has comfortable plastic handles and is constructed with eco-friendly P.E.T (Polyethylene terephthalate). The bag is made from post-consumer water bottles (85% from water bottles,15% from other recycled materials). It's 22"H x 16"W x 11"D. Big enough to carry lots of livestock bags. It also folds up for flat easy

storage. The bag is black with the BAS logo in yellow on one side, and features a unique full Velcro closure to keep your fish and corals safely in and the elements out. Members cost is only \$10. You can purchase one at one of our events

Interested in going to the Peruvian Amazon to collect fish and then bring them back? Copa Airlines has great prices on round trip tickets -LAX to Iquitos for \$700. You will fly from LAX to Panama City, Panama and then a direct flight from PC to Iquitos. I just purchased mine. Will be leaving LAX on Friday, 15 March (take a red eye out of LA and arrive in Iquitos the next day at 2:30 PM) and returning Saturday, 23 March.

The cost break down will look something like this: **Flight** - \$700.00 **Hotel** - \$20 - \$40/day depending on where people stay. The hotel I stay at is \$40 a night, which includes a small kitchenette with fridge and ac, and hot shower. They also have a few of two bedroom places, but am not sure of the cost.

Food - \$15-\$35/day depends on what you like to eat. Grilled chicken and fries around \$7.00

Guide - \$15/day

Transportation - \$10-\$15/day

You will also have a chance to visit some of the fishermen's houses and exporters to purchase fish that you may be interested in. If you are interested, contact me directly for the information.



TIP OF THE MONTH

When you have to replace evaporated water from your marine aquariums, replace it with fresh water, since none of the sea salt is lost during evaporation. If you just add more salt water that would alter the specific gravity of the aquarium's water, which will put stress on your fish and corals.


