The Brooklyn Aquarium Society's Educating Aquarists Q & A feature is located on our Forum. Anyone may participate by registering and choosing a screen name. You may post any question related to fish, invertebrates, equipment or aquatic diseases. By posting a relevant question, you will receive 5 points. Post your question as a normal online post in the Q & A section. Anyone may post an answer and get 1 point. The answer is posted as a reply. The question remains open for a week. The author of the best answer gets an additional 3 points. If the question is not answered or is incorrect by the end of that week, the experts on our Board of Directors will choose or provide a best answer. The first round of Q & A begins at our October event and runs until December 31, 2014. The persons with the most points for answers and for questions will each win \$20 in BA\$ Bucks, or a free 1 year (individual) BAS membership or a one year subscription to an aquatic magazine. (In the event a subscription cannot be obtained, a prize of equal or greater value will be supplied at the discretion of the BAS Board of Directors.) The winners of each category will be given the option of choosing their prize. The 2nd round of Q & A's begins at our January 2015 event and runs until March 31. There are no carry-over points; all participants start with zero. The 3rd round will begin at our April 2015 event and run until June 30. 



U.N. ISSUED ENDANGERED FISH SPECIES STAMP

n 23 October 2014, the U.N. Postal Administration (UNPA) issued a set of 12 stamps depicting endangered species. The series was launched in 1993 to highlight the need for the protection of endangered species. This year's Endangered Species feature marine life:

• The US \$1.15 stamps depict these endangered species: *Hippocampus denise* (Denise's pygmy seahorse),

Rhincodon typus (Whale shark), Sphyrna lewini (Scalloped hammerhead), Scleropages formosus (Asian arowana). • The CHF 1.40 stamps depict these endangered species:



Arapaima gigas (Arapaima), *Cetorhinus maximus* (Basking shark),

Pristis pristis (Largetooth sawfish), *Acipenser baerii* (Siberian sturgeon).

• The \in 0.70 stamps depict these

endangered species: *Cheilinus undulatus* (Humphead wrasse), *Carcharodon*

carcharias (Great white shark), *Manta birostris* (Giant manta ray), *Polyodon spathula* (Paddlefish). The artist, Amadeo Bachar (USA) has had a strong curiosity for the physical and biological processes that make our world. For Amadeo one of the best ways to understand those things was to illustrate them. Working with renowned organizations such as National Geographic, Scientific American, California Department of Fish and Wildlife he was able to bring these skills to public. His fish identifications are done in truly mixed medium of graphite, watercolor and Photoshop.



TP OF THE MONTH

It's always a good idea to find out the specific gravity of the water in your dealer's tanks before buying fishes, so that you can adjust the initial conditions in your quarantine tank to suit your new fish and slowly acclimate them to the water quality in your main aquarium. This will also reduce the risk of introducing diseases to your aquarium. You can also use this time to acclimatize your new fish to the foods you feed to the fish in your aquarium. Some fish are difficult to acclimate to aquarium diets. Ask your dealer to feed the fish you are interested in buying to be sure they are eating. Do not buy any fish that refuse to eat, no matter how much you love them.


