

why. It would be helpful to everyone.



## THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER

odd C. Lajeunesse is an associate professor at Pennsylvania State University, Department of Biology. He has been invited to lecture in countries around the world and also here in the States. His latest research grant in 2013 was from the U.S National Science Foundation was on the physiology and ecology of widespread "stress-tolerant" coral endosymbionts: coral "saviors" or opportunistic invaders?

Todd is also on the Editorial Board, Symbiosis (2007-present) NSF review panel: Symbiosis, Defense and Self-recognition (2010, 2013) NSF review panel: Biological Oceanography (2007) Outside reviewer for articles submitted to *Applied Environmental Microbiology*, *Biological Bulletin*, *Coral Reefs*, *Functional Ecology*, *Global Change Biology Journal of Phycology*, *Marine Biology*, *Marine Ecology Progress Series*, *Molecular Ecology*, *Nature Climate Change*, *Oceanography and Limnology*, *Proceedings of the National Academy of Science*, *Proceedings of the Royal Society London B*, *Protist*, *Symbiosis*.

He has also taught courses on Invertebrate Zoology Freshman Seminar and is a regular guest Lecturer in Symbiosis, Coral reef systems, Science Diving.

Todd has written over fifty articles ranging from coral symbiosis to a connection between colony biomass and death in Caribbean reef-building corals to spring "bleaching" among Pocillopora in the Sea of Cortez, Eastern Pacific. Coral reefs, and different algal symbionts explain the vertical distribution of dominant reef corals in the eastern Pacific, among the many studies he has written about.

The April talk will be on *Coral Physiology, Ecology, Symbiosis and Evolution*. Todd will be available after the talk to answer questions on corals and their evolution.

This is a great meeting for anyone who wants to know more about the corals they're keeping and for those looking forward to setting up a reef aquarium.

# T-SHIRT DESIGN CONTEST EXTENDED TO APRIL 10

everal members have requested that the T-shirt design contest deadline be extended, so we have extended it to the April 10th meeting. Members have also asked if we could bring back some of the older BAS shirts that were designed years ago. We are looking into that option.

Members have also asked if we could bring back our popular, one size fits all, baseball style hats. The hats are dark blue and have our logo embroidered on the front. We are thinking of adding "Educating Aquarists Since 1911" to the design.

#### SOME GUIDELINES FOR DESIGNING FOR SCREEN PRINTING:

- When designing artwork for screen printing, keep your design to 6 colors or less. Screen printing is completely different from another type of printing called 4-color process, which can blend colors to produce shades. Silk screened designs do not blend colors. Our advice is to stick to between 1 and 6 colors -- the fewer, the better.
  - Don't use thin lines in your design; they will not print properly.
- The name of the Society or our logo should be included in the design. The logo could be placed on the upper left hand side of the shirt, where the pocket would be. It should be in color. The official colors of the Society are dark blue and gold. (That would be 2 screens, 1 for each color.)
- We often print the design on a color shirt, so make sure your design looks good on a dark or color background.
- Keep in mind that in your design, the color of the shirt will show through where there is no artwork. To get around that, you might design the artwork on a white background (that would be an extra screen).
- The artwork must be separated into different layers of color, which are printed one at a time.
- If you design with a computer, the artwork must be 300 DPI resolution and, secondly, remember that a photograph cannot easily be separated into 4 or less colors.

The less colors you use the better; it will help keep the cost of printing the shirts down and keep the design simple.

The Brooklyn Aquarium Society's Educating **Aquarists Q & A** feature is located on our Forum. Anyone may participate by registering and choosing a screen name. You may post any question related to fish, invertebrates, equipment or aquatic diseases. By posting a relevant question, you will receive 5 points. Post your question as a normal online post in the Q & A section. Anyone may post an answer and get 1 point. The answer is posted as a reply. The question remains open for a week. The author of the best answer gets an additional 3 points. If the question is not answered or is incorrect by the end of that week, the experts on our Board of Directors will choose or provide a best answer. The first round of Q & A begins at our October event and runs until December 31, 2014. The persons with the most points for answers and for questions will each win \$20 in BA\$ Bucks, or a free 1 year (individual) BAS membership or a one year subscription to an aquatic magazine. (In the event a subscription cannot be obtained, a prize of equal or greater value will be supplied at the discretion of the BAS Board of Directors.) The winners of each category will be given the option of choosing their prize. The 2nd round of Q & A's

begins at our January 2015 event and runs until March 31. There are no carry-over points; all participants start with zero. The 3rd round will begin at our April 2015 event and run until June 30. Summaries and final results will appear in the *BAS Bulletin*, and *Aquatica*. The posting scores will be announced at our events.

(**Note:** All sarcastic, insulting posts or foul language will be deleted. Answers supplied by the BAS experts will not receive any points.)

#### Q & A RULES -

- 1. Anyone may participate, Members and Non-Members.
- **2.** Ask an aquatic question by posting a thread under the Q & A logo. You get 5 pts for just posting a question.
- 3. Questions may be about fish, coral, inverts or any aquatic topic. Please keep the Q & A less than 1 page.
- **4**. Anyone answering a question gets 1 point.
- 5. Within a week, our expert panel will pick the best answer. The author of the best answer gets 3 extra points, plus the 1 point for answering the question 6. The persons with the most Question points and the person with the most Answer points will be announced at the next BAS event. The winners, if present, will choose their prize. If not present, they will be notified via the Forum and can respond back for their prize selection.
- 7. In the event that no one answers your question, an expert from our panel will post an answer. (*Expert's answers do not receive points.*)
- **8.** You can ask or answer the same question only once for points.
  - **9.** You can edit your question or answer the same day.
  - **10.** You can ask or answer no more than 10 questions a day.
  - **11.** You cannot ask and answer your own question.
  - **12.** Current standings will be posted monthly in the *Bulletin*.

#### NEW NEW YORK REGULATIONS COVERING SEVERAL FRESHWATER AND MARINE SPECIES EFFECTIVE AS OF MARCH 10, 2015

ew New York regulations covering several freshwater & marine species are effective as of March 10, 2015 See http://www.pijac.org/issue-

updates/new-york-invasivespecies-regulations-effective-m arch-10-2015 for list of prohibited and regulated species.

#### Added to regulated species:

Carassius auratus -Goldfish- all varieties Cyprinus carpio -Koi – all varieties Pterois miles & Pterois volitans -Lionfishs only these 2 species

 See PIJAC UPDATE for links to complete regulations that also include a complete list of PROHIBITED SPECIES and REGULATED SPECIES.

 All "Regulated" fish and animals sold in NYS must be labeled "Invasive Species – Harmful to the Environment" in at least 14-pt bold type attached to the containers housing live animals and attached to the plants. The labels must be approved by the Department of Agriculture and Markets and shall offer alternative non-invasive species as well as instructions to care for the animals or plants in a way to prevent their spread by being introduced into a "freeliving" state.

Any person who purchases a regulated invasive species shall be required to follow any instructions required by the regulations and maintain the required instructions until the

regulated invasive species is disposed of in a manner that renders it non-living or non-viable.

These regulations extend to all retailers, wholesalers, pond installers, hobbyists, carnivals, and producers selling in or shipping into New York State. These rules also apply to all Internet sellers shipping into New York.

This applies to all specimens shipped into or acquired in New York from any source.

Please alert your membership and others you believe need to be informed.

#### PLEASE USE THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES FOR GROUP INTERACTIONS:



## TIP OF THE MONTH

ow is the time when pondkeepers begin to get ready for warmer weather. You should examine your pond for winter damage and clean the pond of any debris and inspect all hoses for leaks. Also test your pump and filter in shallow water to ensure they are working properly. If there is a problem, now is the time to replace them. Check to see if your lining needs to be replaced.

This is also the time to think about expansion and upgrading. Now is a good time to think about adding floating, submerged or potted plants. These plants add valuable nutrients and oxygen to the water, and they also provide shade and shelter for fish.




