


104 Years of Educating Aquarists THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



You may post any question related to fish, invertebrates, equipment or aquatic diseases. By posting a relevant question, you will receive 5 points. Post your question as a normal online post in the Q & A section. Anyone may post an answer and get 1 point. The answer is posted as a reply. The question remains open for a week. The author of the best answer gets an additional 3 points. If the question is not answered or is incorrect by the end of that week, the experts on our Board of Directors will choose or provide a best answer. The first round of Q & A begins at our October event and runs until December 31, 2014. The persons with the most points for answers and for questions will each win \$20 in BA\$ Bucks, or a free 1 year (individual) BAS membership or a one year subscription to an aquatic magazine. (In the event a subscription cannot be obtained, a prize of equal or greater value will be supplied at the discretion of the BAS Board of Directors.) The winners of each category will be given the option of choosing their prize. The 2nd round of Q & A's

begins at our January 2015 event and runs until March 31. There are no carry-over points; all participants start with zero. The 3rd round will begin at our April 2015 event and run until June 30. Summaries and final results will appear in the *BAS Bulletin*, and *Aquatica*. The posting scores will be announced at our events. 8. You can ask or answer the same question only once for points.


9. You can edit your question or answer the same day.


NEWS & NOTES

There is a massive push in the industry to sell small table-top or personal tanks, in the range of two to eight gallons. They are made from plastic rather than glass. Retailers that stock these and make attractive live-fish displays are guaranteed to sell more bettas, neon tetras, glowlight tetras and other small species that can survive in close quarters. Most of these are relatively inexpensive, unless you get into the newer micro-species coming from Myanmar, Laos, Cambodia and Vietnam.

A really big livestock trend plays into the nano-tank theme very well. Most of the rest of the world is way ahead of us in falling in love with exotic freshwater shrimp. They have been around for years in Asia and Europe, but they are just starting to surge in popularity in the U.S. The desktop tanks work great for most of the shrimp species.

Only a few are so big or aggressive that they require larger quarters.

responsible for inter-member transactions. You can bring any items for exchange to one of our monthly club events in person.





TIP OF THE MONTH

Then setting up a new aquarium, make sure that the foundation you are setting it on is firm and level and able to withstand the weight. Water is heavy; it weighs 8.34 pounds per gallon. For example, a 2 ½ gallon tank filled with water weighs 27 lbs. A 50 gallon tank filled with water weighs 600 lbs. 


