
For the ere are some tips on how to protect your aquariums, either marine or freshwater, in case there's a power failure this winter.

To maintain temperature, fill a zip-lock bag with hot tap water. <u>Make sure it's sealed</u> and place it in the tank. If you have no water pressure, then heat a pot of tank water and put the water into the zip-lock bag or a sealed plastic container and float it in the tank.

As the temperature continues to fall, remove the container holding hot water and reheat it.

Aerate water. You should have an emergency battery-operated aerator. Place it in the tank to keep the water moving. You can purchase aerators at a pet shop or even a bait shop for \$10 to \$12; they work on D batteries.

When the power comes back, do not feed the fish immediately. Wait until the water temperature has returned to normal. Good luck for a steady power filled winter!



Besides running the largest general aquarium society in the country Joe created a fantasy action adventure novel entitled *The Journey of Mary/Ma Li*.


Joe's work has been published by Dreams Publishing Company.




