

# THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER



**Toe Yaiullo** is the Curator of Long Island Aquarium and Exhibition Center.

Born and raised on Long Island, Joe graduated Southampton College with a BS

in Marine Biology.

Joe worked at the New York Aquarium for 8 years (1987-1995), and left to pursue a dream of building an aquarium on Long Island. He was instrumental in designing, developing and building Long Island Aquarium and Exhibition Center, 431 East Main Street, Riverhead, NY, 11901 which opened in June 2000. Long Island Aquarium and Exhibition Center exhibits include a 2,000-gallon clownfish/anemone tank, 120,000-gallon Shark Tank and a 20,000 gallon Live Coral Tank, which to date is the largest closed reef system in North and South America, and the 4th largest in the world.

Long Island Aquarium and Exhibition Center also features a unique 2 hour environmental tour boat, Atlantis Explorer, that navigates down the Peconic River and Flanders Bay. The tour is hosted by naturalists. The tour includes hands-on activities such as trap pulls, plankton tows, live underwater video footage of the various types of marine life encounted off Long Island beaches.

There is also a shoreline stroll along a remote region of Flanders Bay. Their web site is (longislandaquarium.com) Their phone number is 631-208-9200.





## NEWS & NOTES



on Flatbush Avenue in the heart of Brooklyn opened its doors in 1986. Robert Sakowitz, one of the partners, had worked with his brother

Mark, who owned and operated Mark's Aquarium. The brothers had a falling out and Robert joined with Allen Roth; together they opened World Class Aquarium. Both Robert and Allen were highly regarded as experts in the pet industry.

Robert Sakowitz was interviewed by the NY Times on June 23, 1991 by **Richard D. Lyons**. The title of the story was "90's Pets, the More Exotic the Better." Robert was asked his opinion on snakes and fish as pets.

Allen Roth, a marine biologist, built custom display tanks for the Wildlife Conservation Society at the Bronx Zoo for reptile display exhibits. He also worked at the New York Aquarium and other state aquariums. At the NY Aquarium, he reportedly worked with **Joe** Yaiullo, the curator of the Long Island Aquarium and Exhibition Center in Riverhead, Long Island. Allen was not only a businessman, but he was also a hobbyist. He was a guest speaker at the Greater City Aquarium Society in Flushing, Queens and was a sponsor for that Society. He was also a member of the Long Island Killifish club. It was reported that this club had meetings at the World Class Aquarium back in the day. Allen was a builder of custom tanks. One of his creations was the angled front glass of large aquariums. He must have started a trend because odd design custom tanks are readily available today.

Allen Roth's expertise came to the forefront when he was interviewed by the NY Daily News on December 8, 1996 by **Lenore Skenazy** on the topic,



"The Good The Bad And The Cuddly - The Truth About Cats & Dogs & Other Pet Gifts." Allen spoke about the benefits of having fish and birds as pets.

For 31 years, World Class Aquarium was one of Brooklyn's dynamic pet stores. It had everything contained within its walls. If you were looking for fish, fresh water or marine, aquariums, reptiles, birds, equipment, supplies or just expert knowledge, that was the >in< place. I visited often and always left with something that I could use or maybe thought I could use in the future. I enjoyed the children when they visited the store. They would walk around with mom and dad to see the fish, reptiles and birds. It was pure joy and amazement to them. This was better than a zoo because there were almost no barriers between them and the animals. They were mesmerized and thrilled. You could guarantee that mom and dad would have a hard time getting them to leave.

Several years ago, World Class Aquarium hired Marty Karfinkel as their store manager. Marty revolutionized the store. He's a master salesman and great organizer. Marty worked for Petland Discounts for 30 years and prior to that worked at Al's Aquarium on Nostrand & Snyder Avenues, as well as Al's other store on 18th Avenue and 84th Street. Marty promoted the Brooklyn Aquarium Society starting back in 1967 while learning the trade at Al's Aquarium by donating pet merchandise and explaining to customers that an educated aquarist promotes the aquatic environment.

He brought *Tropical Fish Hobbyist* magazine to the store and promoted the magazine to customers. Marty pushed knowledge because he knew it would make any hobbyist a better hobbyist. While at World Class, he

was able to grant discounts to BAS members and he influenced Robert and Allen to donate to our monthly events. Because of Marty, World Class became a full sponsor to BAS. We thank him for that and all he has given to our great Society.

Throughout the years, many notables from the Brooklyn Aquarium Society became involved with pet stores because they had a calling to be concerned with aquatic creatures and livestock in general. It is a special calling to obtain knowledge and then be able to share it with others. It is a wonderful and fulfilling trait. Over the decades, we had former BAS President Al DiSpigna, [2003-2007] who learned his fish trade at Al's Aquarium, as did Marty. Seth Kolker, [1989-2001] BAS President for 12 years, worked at World Class as did Bill Amely.

Local pet shops are a dying industry. Most are being driven out by larger conglomerates such as Petco and on-line pet industry super stores. What people fail to realize is that with the demise of local shops, their help with questions and to obtain a needed part or medication also dies. Where will mom and dad bring their children to see and experience live animals?



# TIP OF THE MONTH

If it's time to upgrade your lighting the new LED aquarium lamps are an excellent choice. Long lasting, energy efficient LED lights are 20% brighter than standard fluorescent bulbs; these lighting fixtures create naturalistic day and night time lighting for a realistic aquatic environment.

ZooMed module system may be a good choice. They have 3 different modules that can be interchanged in their fixtures: standard module that provides bright white light for viewing & shimmer effect and blue light for coral growth & moonlight effect; plant module designed to provide the correct wavelengths needed for promoting chlorophyll absorption and photosynthesis in plants, and a Daylight module for increased white light in your aquarium that includes 4 white 6000k LEDs (one watt ea), and 2 white 6000k LEDs (500 milliwatts ea). Check them out. They maybe just what you need to upgrade your aquarium lighting.





The bag is made from post-consumer water bottles (85% from water bottles, 15% from other recycled materials). It's 22"H x 16"W x 11"D, big enough to carry lots of livestock. The bag is black with the BAS logo in gold. It features a full Velcro closure keeping fish and corals safe, cool in the summer and warm in the winter.
