of the Betty Mueller Award from the Northeast Council of Aquatic Societies for his contributions to the hobby and has published in many hobby magazines, including TFH.


Rit maintains 45 tanks, some of which do not

He was elected Chairman of the Board of Directors in Oct. 2003 and was re-elected four times.

Rit was honored by Aqualand in December of 1999 with a honorary lifetime membership for his "sincere dedication and generous support."

He also is an honorary lifetime member of the Pioneer Valley Aquarium Society (MA), 2006 Recipient
