fish at the age of eight when she was visiting one of her parents' friends, Carl Gruber, whose basement was made into a fishroom. Carl spent most of the evening with Carol, telling her all about his fish. She was hooked. After that her parents gave in to her pleading and got her a small aquarium with some guppies from the local Woolworth's.

When she was in Junior High, one of the girls in her class said her dad was opening a tropical fish store, and she invited Carol to meet him and see the store that afternoon. He was a hobbyist who brought about ten pairs of breeding angelfish. He sold the baby angels, five for a dollar which in the early fifties was exceptionally reasonable for young angels. He then added other fish to the mix in the store. Carol spent almost every afternoon there. Martin Weintraub was always patient and kind to Carol in spite of the fact that she says she was really a pest. Martin's Aquarium, became very successful in the Philadelphia area.

After that, Carol almost always kept aquariums, and the first fishes she bred were zebra danios and bettas, both of which she got from Martin's. Carol says that the only time she didn't have aquariums was when she attended the Univ. of Pennsylvania, but when she transferred to Penn State and got married, she had several refrigerator liners in the back yard, as well

as three 15-gal tanks inside.

When she started teaching 4th grade in the mid sixties, she had an aquarium in her classroom. Each year the kids and Carol would plan how to set up the tank. She would then take a group of about eight kids down to Martin's and they would pick out fish (with Carol's help, of course). At the end of the year she dismantled the aquarium, and the fish and plants went home with the kids.

Carol's interests really took off after she retired in 2000, and although she doesn't have a fishroom, she has about 15 tanks ranging in size from 55 gallons down and keeps some small community tanks and a couple of species tanks. Carol says she doesn't have the room or the water supply to keep large fish.

Carol has been a member of the Bucks County Aquarium Society for about 12 years, and is at present the vice president, membership chair, editor and exchange editor of their newsletter, *The Buckette*.

She's also been a member of several other local clubs, but because she doesn't drive at night any more, she can't always attend meeting. However, if she gets a ride, she tries to attend as many society meetings as she possibly can.

Carol will give a power point presentation about her collecting trip, so come spend an evening collecting fish with Carol in Peru.

AQUARIUM HEATERS RECALLED DUE TO FIRE AND LACERATION HAZARDS



The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using re-

called products immediately.

NAMÉ OF PRODUCT: Marineland Stealth and Stealth Pro Aquarium Heaters.

IMPORTER: United Pet Group, of Cincinnati, Ohio

HAZARD: A wiring problem can cause the aquarium heaters to overheat or break during normal use, damaging the aquarium and posing fire and laceration hazards to consumers. Overheating can cause the heater to shatter or the aquarium glass to break.

DESCRIPTION: The recall involves the following Marineland Stealth and Stealth Pro aquarium heaters. The heaters are black plastic tubes and have a temperature adjustment knob at the top. The model name "Stealth" (in white letters) or "Stealth Pro" (in red letters) is printed on the side of the heater. The model number and the wattage rating are printed below the model name. Stealth Pro heaters were also sold as part of aquarium starter kits.

SOLD AT: Pet stores nationwide and on various websites from January 2004 through February 2011 for between \$20 and \$300.

MANUFACTURED IN: China and Italy.

REMEDY: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled aquarium heaters and contact United Pet Group for a free replacement aquarium heater or a full refund.

n Arizona appeals court says a business owner is entitled to challenge the constitutionality of state rules barring her from using fish in her salon pedicures.

The Arizona Court of Appeals ruled Friday that Cindy Vong can sue over the Arizona Board of Cosmetology's threat to pull her license if she didn't stop offering the pedicure, which uses fish to eat dead skin off clients' feet.

The Board said the fish were unsafe because they couldn't be sterilized.
