THIS MONTH'S SPEAKER

oe Caparatta is a thirty-six year old pisces, born and raised in Oceanside NY. He purchased his first aquarium at age twelve with paper route money and was immediately hooked. He quit the paper route to work after school at Ecosystem aquarium in Oceanside which was owned by Perry Eng. Joe worked every day after school under Perry's guidance until he was 18. From here, he took a job at Pet Stop in Plainview Long Island while attending Nassau Community College in pursuit of a path in marine biology.

He transferred to Richard Stockton College, graduating, with a BS in biology and a minor in marine biology.

While at college, he came home on weekends to service his ten or so maintenance accounts he picked up in Plainview. Upon graduation, Joe took a full time position at Pet Stop of Huntington LI in full charge of a respectable fish room. He did this for one full year until he had enough service clients to leave and start Blue Marlin Aquarium Design.

Joe built this service/installation business on his own for 2 years before taking on a partner for four more years. In 2001, he broke away and created NY Aquarium Service. Seven years later came Manhattan Aquariums, followed shortly by <u>UniqueCorals.com</u>. Joe is the sole owner of all three companies. He now has 18 full time employees, servicing over 400 tanks a month.

Joe says they have "perfected" the logistics of how to service aquariums in a crazy city such as Manhattan and has become the largest service company in this city. Joe has done all kinds of projects aside from the typical aquarium setups. Jobs like photo shoots for top designers, providing fish life support for Iron Chef "secret ingredients," working with Seaworld whenever they are on the Today Show, Extreme Home Makeover, etc., etc.

His company has recently installed the tank for the movie *Arthur*. Presently, they are filming a pilot for a new reality show about their work. Hopefully you will catch it on a network soon!

Manhattan Aquariums has over 8000 gallons of marine inventory and boasts the largest coral inventory in the northeast. They are now direct importers and wholesalers of coral from Australia, Tonga and Jakarta. Although working in the store, designing and installing aquariums is his main focus, his true passion is working with live coral. Fragging and growing the wildest strains of both hard and soft coral along with building and maintaining large systems capable of supporting the needs of the frags is where his focus wants to be. Hopefully, in the near future a marine greenhouse/warehouse can be the new home of <u>uniquecorals.com</u>.

Roger bequeathed all his aquarium equipment, tanks and livestock to the Brooklyn Aquarium Society.


JAMAICA BAY

The City Department of Environmental Protection has embarked on a plan to grow mussels in Jamaica Bay as a way to filter out nitrogen and bacteria, officials said yesterday.

Five cargo net structures were placed in Fresh Creek, a tributary of Jamaica Bay, to create a mussel habitat. The DEP will monitor the site over the next two years.

The project is part of the DEP's efforts to improve water quality in Jamaica Bay. It has also made efforts to restore eelgrass and oysters to the area.
